Vivid's strategic planning runs on a three year cycle and 2021 sees the end of one such cycle, and the commencement of the next. So this is an opportune time to reflect on the success of the 2018-2021 Strategic Plan and sneak a look at what the 2021-2024 Plan will be seeking to achieve.

The 2018-2021 Plan's foundations were some entirely unsurprising Core Goals - Provider of Choice, Employer of Choice, Infrastructure and Technology, Leading Regional Disability Service and Financial Sustainability.

Achievement of the Goals was driven by over 50 projects which delivered improvements in areas such as the quality of services, client and staff satisfaction, data digitisation of records, an overhaul of Vivid's fleet of buses and other vehicles, and a rebranding of the organisation (once we were known as Murray Human Services, but now We are Vivid).

It was, particularly in the context of the roll out of the National Disability Insurance Scheme, a transformational period.

The 2021-2024 Plan retains the Core Goals and has an even more ambitious program of projects, the centrepiece of which will be the revitalisation of ageing infrastructure, commencing with the High Street South site in Echuca.

Every project we embark on must, of course, drive Vivid's mission to assist people with disability to lead great lives.

- Residential accommodation





The 2020-2021 financial year continued to be affected by COVID-19 shut downs and restrictions.

Revenue increased by 9% to \$11,916,234 including JobKeeper reimbursements of \$2,866,550.

Vivid ceased to be eligible for JobKeeper from January 2021.


Expenses increased by 10.5% including JobKeeper payments made to staff.


Investment reserves increased to nearly \$1.3 million as part of total current assets of \$5,899,198 - an increase of 13.6% on last year.

A revaluation of land and buildings added \$1,470,504 to comprehensive income.

Total current liabilities have reduced to \$1,707,559 meaning that every dollar of liability is covered by \$3.45 of current assets, putting Vivid in a strong position as we navigate a challenging environment and invest in the future of the organisation.

Vivid has no long term borrowings and other fixed assets are valued at \$9,277,141.
